On January 13, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The question in this grievance is whether management improperly required the grievant to carry a portion of another route without additional compensation.


During our discussion, it was mutually agreed that the following would represent a full settlement of this case:


The postmaster shall not unilaterally require a regular rural letter carrier to carry a portion of another rural route. In addition, the postmaster shall ensure that the grievant's EMA was properly adjusted to include payment for any additional mileage he traveled while delivering the extra mail.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to settle this case.
